All forms will be destroyed on Election Day. We require only your name and place of residence (city and country). Full address is optional. Please include your email address if you would like to receive occasional updates on the '100,000'. All data will be compiled for statistical purposes only and will not be used in any other way or passed on to third parties.

Register to vote and obtain your absentee ballot by contacting your election official in the US county in which you last resided and/or voted. Most states have websites to assist you; search for "voter registration + your state". If you are an American citizen who has never resided in the US, you can still vote in the US federal elections.

Voter registration assistance is provided by US Consulate Services in the country in which you live (<http://travel.state.gov/links.htm>).
